Club Rides

Ride safety – recent events cause us all to reflect on safety during rides. The suggestion was made about the use of corner marshals or corner markers. The next rider after the ride leader stops in a safe place on the corner, his/her indicator on to tell the riders behind which direction to go. The corner marshal then tucks in front of tail end Charlie. The next rider behind the ride leader then becomes the next corner marshal. Members agreed in principle that corner marshals should be employed. It was noted that the corner marshal should not then try to race ahead with a view to getting back to the head of the column.

There was also the suggestion that when riding in a group each rider should keep the headlight of the rider behind in his/her view and slow down or stop if the following rider can't be seen. Then, if anything happens, we can readily turn around to investigate or help as needed.

Members endorsed the use of corner marshals on all rides. The process is shown and agreed to. All ride leaders should clarify this before leaving along with briefing riders with directions and stops in case people *inadvertently* go missing.

Remember, the rules of the road apply to all riders. Obviously, this continues to be Ulysses Club policy and practice. All riders are responsible for their own behaviour on rides.

Bike Maintenance News

The views in this article are the views of the writer only, and are written to give members of the "Club" information that may assist them in the safe use of their motorcycle. The writer gains no benefit whatsoever from any product or business as a result of this article. Some information in this article has been obtained from Australian Road Rider and research on the "net".

A few general points that you may gain something from:

Firstly, lets talk about brakes (disc not drum). I recently checked the discs on both bikes and was very happy to find that the K100s (Blacky) front and rear discs were well within the quoted tolerances quoted by BM. She has done over 160.000km and is going fine except for its short-legged rider.

However, when I checked the R1100 (Bluey), I found that the rear was under the quoted tolerances by about 2/3rds of a mil. She has done about 93,000km and has had a bit easier life than Blacky. A little concerned, I spoke to a couple of bike mechanics and found that on some machines, the rear disc can be below the "roadworthy" tolerances within 20.000kms, and the front disc shortly after.

What I suggest is that you check the disc thickness every time you chance the pads. This way you will not be surprised when they are effectively illegal and you won't get short on the road.

Toolkit: Does you bike have one, is it appropriate for the bike and is it in good, useable condition? Look carefully at your toolkit and I suggest you have the following as a min;

1. A range of ring and open-ender spanners that will do most simple jobs when you break down or bust something. Make sure you have the spanners to remove the wheels and covers on the bike.
2. Good pair of pliers is good to have around. Try and get a pair with side cutters, which are great for cutting fencing wire (which I have been known to use to get home).
3. Allen keys and/or a screwdriver (straight and Phillips) are a must.
4. Tube spanners for the spark plug/s.
5. Bulbs; spare headlight bulb, stop/tail light bulb.
6. Spare con link (chain drives) and two cable ends. Cable ends are available for clutch cables and throttle cables (two different sizes). They are small and screw on to the broken cable so you and get home without being shot at by farmers for cutting fences.

There are a few other things that make biking a little easies like a tubeless tyre repair kit, which contains rubber mushrooms to insert into the small hole that appeared magically in your tyre and small cylinder of compressed air to pump up the tyre. It is also in your best interest to carry a good first aid kit, which contains the gear for fixing big holes and grazes, as well as the odd broken bone.

You may think that the above is unnecessary and bulky because you are in the RACQ. Well, if you find yourself on the side of the road with a busted bike, without mobile coverage, and 30km from the nearest town – try smoke signals or enjoy the walk.
